With their special knowledge and the r/evolutionary sound of the ensemble, the members of the Trickster Orchestra forge new worlds and inevitably disrupt traditional boundaries and orders.

The ensemble unites some of the world's most virtuosic soloists and their fascinating range of instruments, carefully selected from diverse cultures, in an musical organism between improvisation and composition. The result is one of the most exciting and innovative music styles of our time, promising completely new sonic experiences. The collective includes soloists from worldwide (art) music traditions, jazz, electronic, Echtzeit-, New Music, as well as free improvisation.

The Trickster Orchestra overcomes the usual boundaries between genres and cultures, which today are spread across geographical, ethnic, and temporal orders. Instead, it uses traditions as toolboxes through which the orchestra advances musical innovation and new, globally entangled sound worlds.

In this way, the Trickster Orchestra, as an internationally renowned ensemble, translates Germany's cultural richness, created through migration, into a multiplication of musical perspectives, artistic possibilities, and creative expression. In this way, the ensemble creates nationally and internationally acclaimed contemporary music that gives expression to the completely changed society of the 21st century at the highest musical level. By giving musicians on non-European instruments a presence in a chamber ensemble of contemporary music, it expands the orchestral paradigm of the 19th century in order to make it suitable for a post-migrant society.

The Trickster Orchestra was founded in 2013 by Cymin Samawatie, Ketan Bhatti, and Philip Geisler and has performed in Europe and West Asia, at the Festival für Modernes Hören and asphalt Festival Düsseldorf, Jazzfest Berlin, Tonlagen Festival Hellerau, Silk Road Festival Baku, the Elbphilharmonie Hamburg, the Alte Oper Frankfurt, the Berliner Konzerthaus and Radialsystem, the Bundeskunsthalle Bonn, and Bauart Istanbul.

In 2021, the debut album was released on the ECM Records label. In 2022, the orchestra won the German Jazz Award as "Large Ensemble of the Year" and the TONALi Classical Music Award "Courage for Utopia." Cymin Samawatie and Ketan Bhatti received the GEMA Music Author Award as composers in 2023. In 2024, the German federal government honored the orchestra by including it in the Excellent Orchestra Landscape Germany.
